What does it mean?

What does it mean?

God provides those who strive and ask for His help.

Allah helps you when you ask him for anything. Such as when we pray for help or success.

What does it mean?

God has created everything in the world. He brought everything from a lower stage to a higher stage and provides what is necessary for its sustenance.

Ultimately, everyone will be rewarded or punished for their deeds by God Almighty.

What does the Promised Messiah^{as} teach us?

What does the Promised Messiah^{as} teach us?



- 4. Arabic compositions contain less words and more meanings.
- 5. The Arabic language inherently possesses the quintessential capability to illustrate a complete picture of the innermost thoughts of the human mind.

1. Which attribute of Allah means He is never limited by time, space, or circumstances?



القادر

Al-Qadir (The All-Powerful)



Al-Qadir refers to Allah's absolute power and ability to do anything, without any limitations. His will is not bound by time, space, or circumstance, meaning He has complete control over everything in the universe. There are no restrictions on Allah's power, and He can create, alter, or sustain anything at any time, regardless of the conditions or context. This attribute signifies that Allah is free from the constraints that affect human beings or creation.



2. Which of Allah's attributes reflects His complete knowledge of everything, even what is hidden or unseen?



العليم

Al-'Aleem (The All-Knowing)



Al-'Aleem denotes Allah's infinite knowledge. He knows everything—what is visible and hidden, what is past, present, and future. There is no secret from Allah, and His knowledge encompasses everything in the universe, from the smallest detail to the grandest events. Unlike human beings who may know only parts of things or who may be limited in understanding, Allah's knowledge is absolute, all-encompassing, and perfect.



3. Allah's attribute of being "Al-Basir" means

Al-Baseer (The All-Seeing)



Al-Baseer means that Allah sees everything, whether it is in the visible world or the unseen. His sight is not limited by physical constraints like human sight; He sees all things at all times. Nothing escapes His gaze, whether it's a tiny ant in the darkest corner or the most distant galaxy. This attribute emphasizes Allah's awareness of all actions and events, both in the physical realm and beyond.



4. Which attribute of Allah indicates His ability to forgive sins, no matter how great they are?



الغفور

Al-Ghafoor (The All-Forgiving)



Al-Ghafoor reflects Allah's boundless capacity for forgiveness. It shows that no matter how numerous or severe the sins may be, Allah is always ready to forgive those who turn to Him in repentance. This attribute encourages believers to never lose hope in Allah's mercy, as He is more willing to forgive than they are to sin. His forgiveness is immense and unconditional for those who sincerely seek it.



5. Allah's attribute of being "Al-Waliyy" refers to His role as?

Al-Waliyy (The Protecting Ally)



Al-Waliyy means that Allah is the ultimate protector, helper, and guardian of the believers. He is not only the Creator of everything but also the one who sustains, defends, and guides His creation, especially His faithful servants. In moments of difficulty, believers can find comfort in the fact that Allah is their protector and ally, always looking out for their best interests, even when they are unaware of it.

4) What is the difference between Hajj and 'Umrah?

'Umrah, was is like a lesser Hajj, wherein various steps of the Hajj were left out and only Tawaf of the Ka'abah and an animal sacrifice would suffice. Furthermore, unlike the Hajj, there was no specified time of the year for the 'Umrah either.








Huzoor (aba) said that there are various narrations about the number of Muslims at the Expedition of Hudaibiyah. Some say there were more than 1,000, some say 1,300, while another narration says 1,400. Other narrations even mention 1,700 Muslims.










Huzoor(aba) said that certain miracles also took place during this journey. There came a point during the journey when there was no water remaining except for that in the vessel of the Holy Prophet(sa). The companions gathered around the Holy Prophet(sa) and told them that the water he had was all that remained and they did not have any water. The Holy Prophet(sa)placed his hand in the vessel and it is said that it was as though streams of water flowed from the Holy Prophet's (sa) fingers and they were all able to drink to their fill and perform ablution.





Huzoor(aba) said that while at Hudaibiyah, the Holy Prophet(sa) instructed for the camels to be slaughtered and distributed. The Holy Prophet(sa) was also gifted some goats which he also instructed to be distributed amongst the Muslims.
